*This tutorial will try to guide you through to cut your cdg and mp3 using the function "Timeline" without losing sync.*

# Timeline

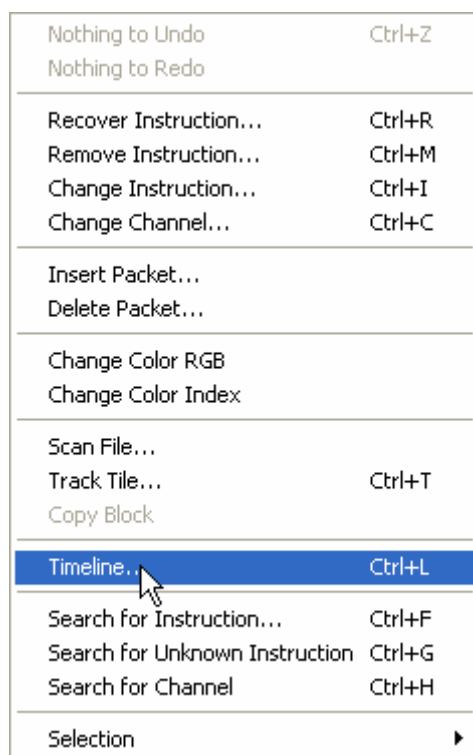
## Introduction

There is a new feature in CDGFix 3.x Super called Timeline, This feature makes it possible to

1. Cut your files without losing sync with your music

So what can we use this feature for? This feature allows you to cut for example long silence at the end or the beginnings of a track avoiding this silence.

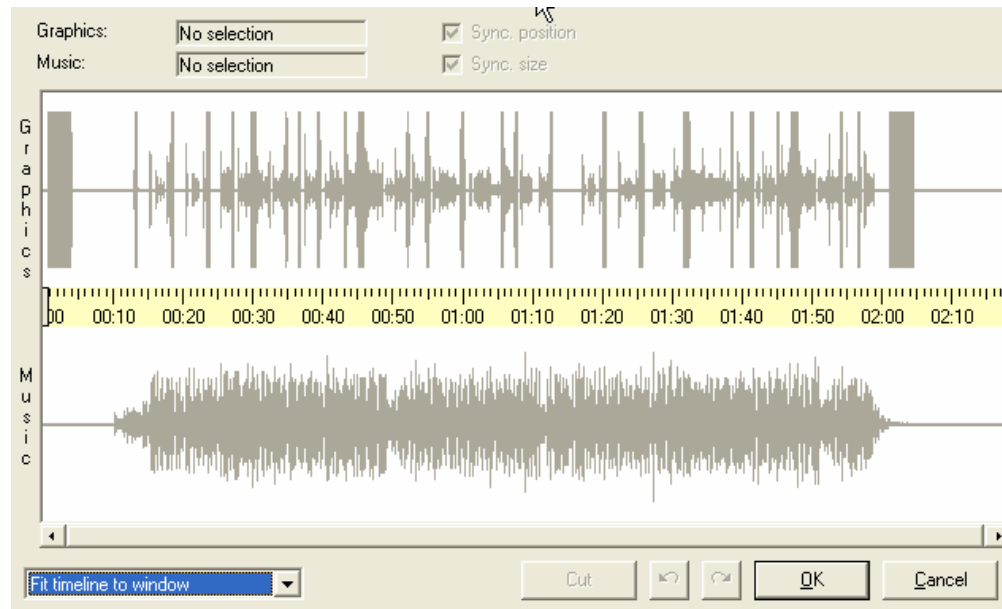
The Timeline window can you find under the Tools Menu on the Main Menu or use the shortcut CTRL + L



Start to load your file you want to cut and make sure this have a corresponding mp3 in the same directory.

The Timeline window has two fields one is your graphic and the other is the music, and the bar that splits those windows is actually the timeline of our song.

**Fig: Timeline Window**

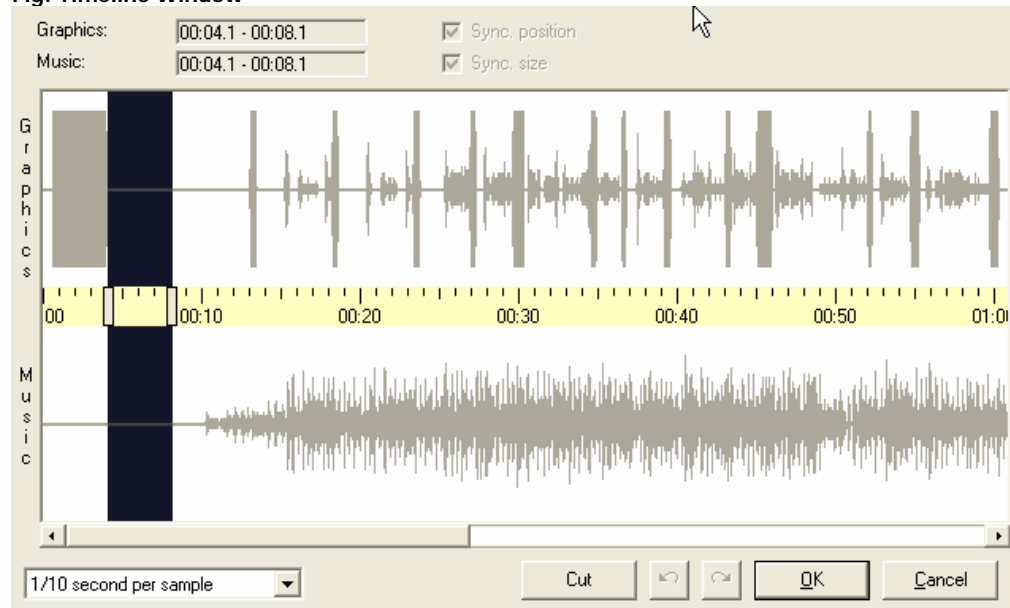


In our demonstration here you can see that our track has almost 10 sec gap before the song actually starts. In this tutorial we will reduce the gap with 5 seconds.

At the beginning of the line, you will see 2 markers. These need to be placed at the points where you want to cut the track like the Fig below.

We mark a start and an end where we want the cut.

**Fig: Timeline Window**



**Hint...** Selecting the option 1/10 second per sample will give you window that's makes the timeline bigger and will let you cut your song with a breeze.

Select Cut and then Ok.

This will then cut 5 seconds off the audio track and the matching graphic file, without affecting the sync of the song.

If you decide that the cut is not right, or you have made a mistake simply Press CTRL & Z or go to tools / Undo Cut.

Good luck with your cutting.
