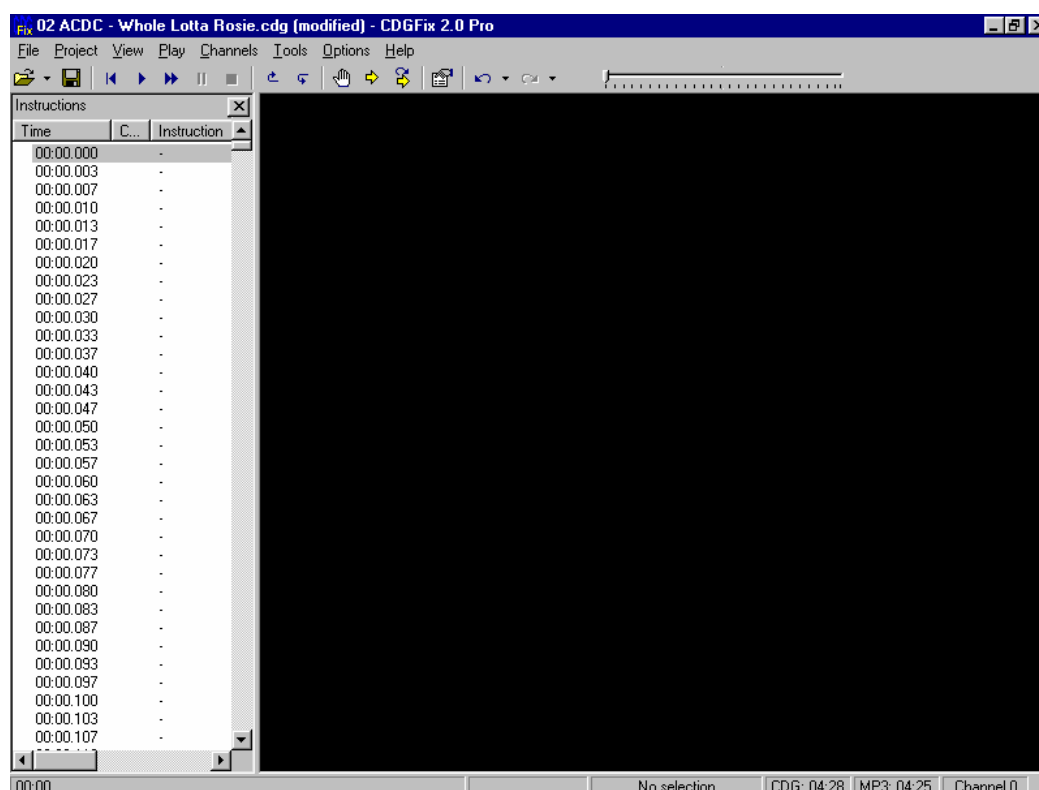


Cutting The Length Of A CDG File

Some of you may have noticed how the start or the end of a song takes ages to arrive or go. After you have cut the beginning of a track with an editor you will notice that the words and music do not line up and are out of sync. Here is an easy Repair for this.

Load the cdg file into the program making sure that the edited mp3 is named the same.

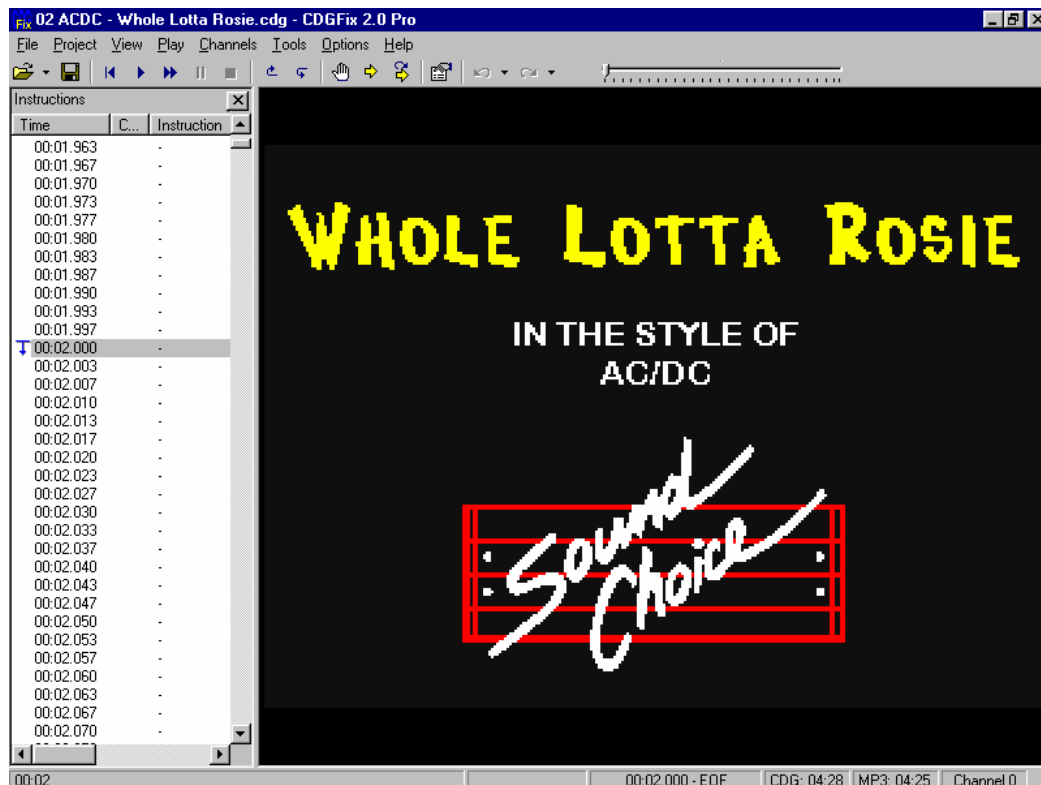


At the bottom of the screen you will notice the length of each file . the cdg and the mp3. where the mp3 has been trimmed, now the cdg file is longer, this needs to be trimmed too.

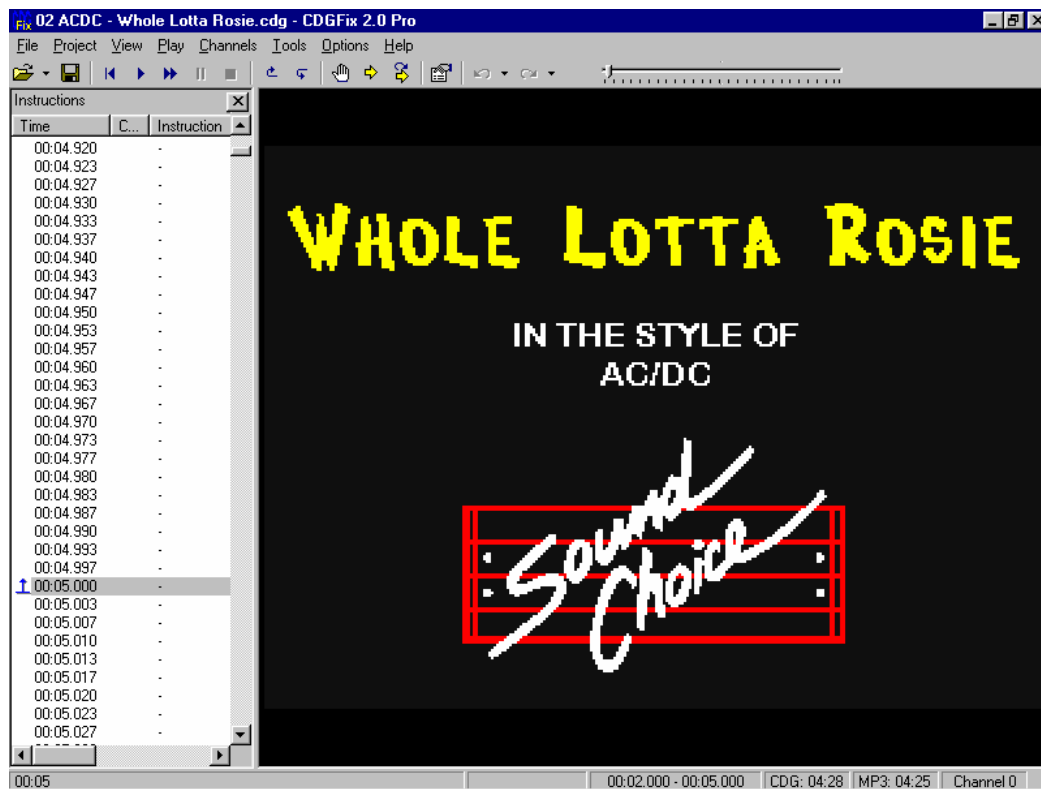
Firstly Remember where you edited the mp3 file. Either the beginning or end , and edit the cdg file the same. If edited from the beginning, do the same with the cdg file.

You will notice that the cdg file is 3 secs longer then the mp3. Press Ctrl & A so that you can see all packets. Now you need to find a 3 second part at the beginning of the track which has no commands in it. This particular file has nothing between 00:01:530 and 00:06:527. so 3 secs can be edited off this. **“DO NOT EDIT ANY COMMANDS AS THIS WILL MESS UP THE FILE TOTALLY. ONLY REMOVE – COMMANDS”**

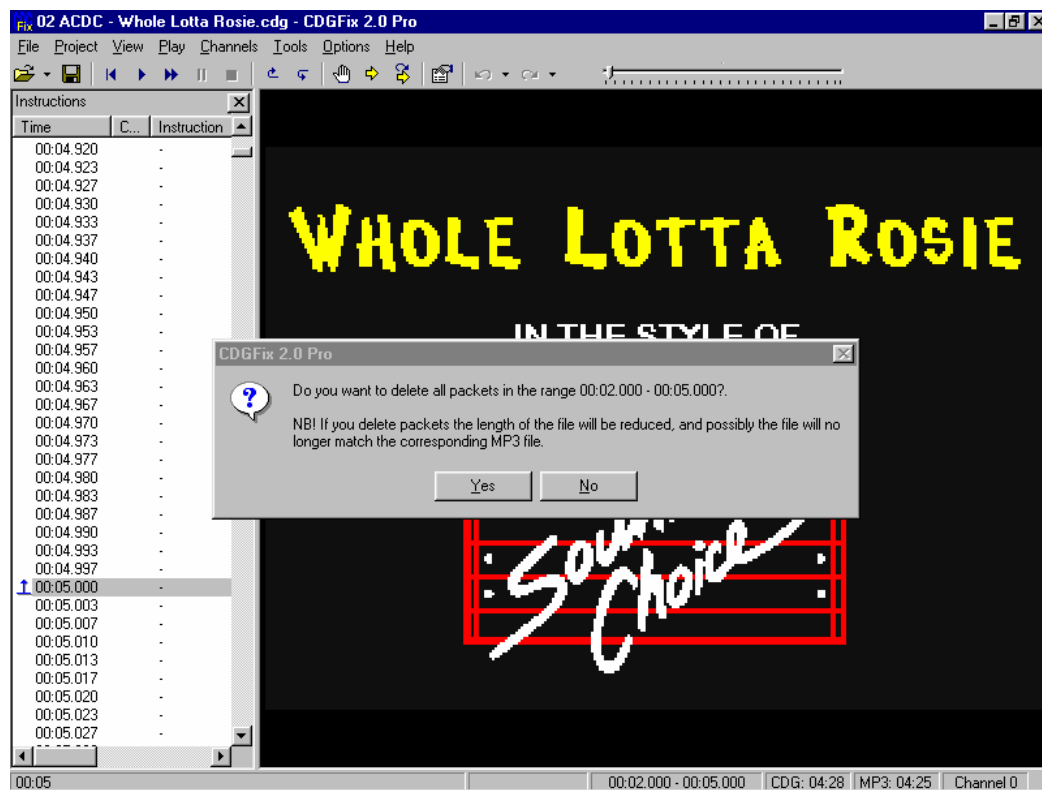
So select a certain point on the file. I have chosen 00:02:000 as to make it easier. Press Ctrl & F9 to select the block and then F3 to mark it.



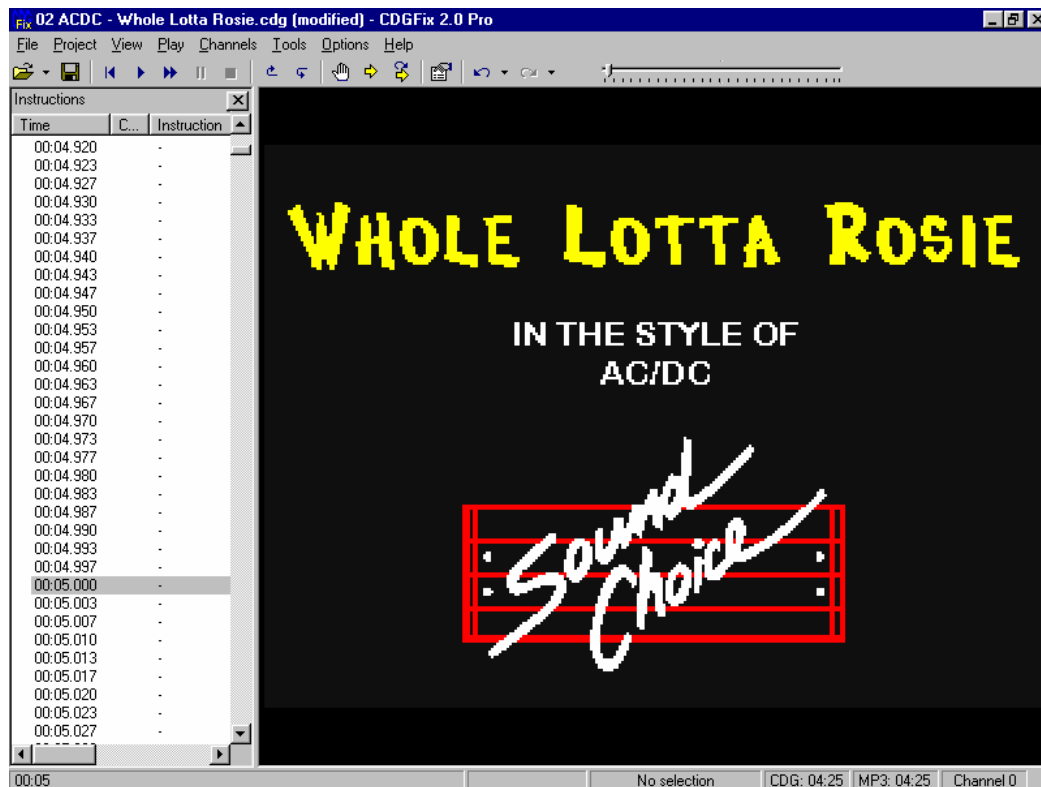
You will now see a arrow pointing down now. Now advance 3 seconds so you must goto 00:05:00. Again Ctrl & F9 and then F to mark it.



you will notice that the arrow now points upwards on this, which is correct.
Now goto tools and delete packet, the program will now detect that you want to delete the pions between the 2 marker points and ask you to verify this.



If you believe that this is correct then select yes and the packets will delete themselves.
Please do not worry if this takes a long time as it is a complicated procedure and will take a minimum of 15 secs depending on the amount you want to trim. Please be patient and let the procedure complete.



now check to make sure the song and words are in sync. If not. Either delete or add more packets depending on how far the sync is out.
